Based on this assessment the peer review team has advised IAC/EADI to take a positive decision regarding the accreditation of your Master Degree Programmes and its general compliance with IAC/EADI criteria. The peer reviewers consider that there is strong evidence indicating that the Programme complies overall with the EADI criteria. In fact, your university certainly offers amongst the richest development studies curricula and thriving learning environments in Eastern Europe, according to the review team.

In its written procedure IAC/EADI has concluded that the peer review team has performed its review in an independent and sound manner, in line with the IAC/EADI standing orders. Its assessment and accreditation advice is consistent and covers the normative accreditation framework as contained in the "IAC/EADI Guide for the Peer Review of development Studies Programmes".



IAC/EADI also notes that the reviewers have a certain number of important critical remarks summarised in the conclusion of the report. IAC/EADI strongly encourages you to consider a mid-term review visit to Olomouc by IAC/EADI in order to consider development on the issues raised in 2 to 3 years time and invites you to indicate whether it agrees to such a follow-up visit.
